	Child Safety Interventions	Intensive Family Preservation	Reunification Support	Relative and Kinship Carer Support
Clients	Families with low to moderate child safety concerns where there is a risk of continuing child abuse or neglect.	Families with significant child safety concerns where the risk of removing the children and placing them in the care of the Chief Executive Officer is high.	Families where the child has been removed and where there are plans to reunify the child with their parents.	Kinship carers and family members who agree to care for related child that has been placed in the care of the Chief Executive Officer.
Eligible families for family support	Families that meet the threshold for child protection intervention, but where an investigation has not be carried out or where the concerns have not been substantiated, but show patterns of behaviour that indicate ongoing low level child safety concerns; or  Following a child protection investigation, a family risk assessment indicates a low to moderate risk.	Following a child protection investigation, a family risk assessment has identified a high/very high risk and the child has remained at home with a safety plan.	A child is on a Protection Order and in the care of the Chief Executive Officer and Department of Children and Families is planning to reunify the family and the child.	A child is on a Protection Order and is placed with a relative or kinship carer.
Outcome	Escalation of abuse and neglect concerns is prevented and families have the capacity to care for and meet the needs of the child.	The safety concerns are reduced and the child is able to safely stay with their family and the family is able independently to meet their needs.	The child is safely reunified with their family and the family is able to care for and meet the needs of their child.	Relative and kinship carers provide stable, supportive care for the child and are able to meet their ongoing needs.
Child Protection Measure	No further child abuse or neglect notifications are recorded for the child.	The child remains at home and does not enter out of home care.	After reunification, there are no further notifications recorded for the child.	The child is in a stable placement with relatives or kin.
